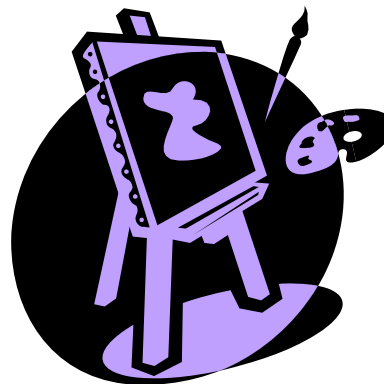
### Holiday Shoppe Committee

### Preventing Bullying at Wolf's Crossing

#### Immediate Consequences for Bullies

If appropriate, impose immediate consequences for students who bully others. Do not make students apologize or make amends during the heat-of-the-moment. Give students time to cool off. All consequences should be logical and connected to the offense. As a first step, you might take away social opportunities (e.g. recess, lunch in the cafeteria, incentives). Let students who bully know you will be watching them and their friends closely to be sure there is no retaliation. Make other colleagues aware of the situation so they can be on the watch too.



#### Buddy System

Ensure protection for students who are bullied. Such protection may include creating a buddy system whereby students have a particular friend or older buddy on whom they can depend and with whom they can spend time when such a problem can occur.

If your child is part of a single parent family, a stepfamily, has experienced the death of a loved family member, friend or sibling, or is struggling with a painful experience, this will be an opportunity for him/her to share with a special someone on the outside what is happening on the inside.

RAINBOWS is a 16 week program that will begin the week of November 10 and will meet for 30 minutes each week. The day and time of the meetings will be determined by what best meets the needs of students, families and facilitators. ### International speaker to empower local students and their parents

### Community invited to hear Board committee recommendations

During the October 6 Board of Education meeting, the Growth, Facilities and Enrollment advisory committee is expected to make its long-awaited recommendations concerning various projects occurring throughout the school district.

The committee was established by the Board this spring and consists of eight members of the community with backgrounds in various areas related to data analysis, finance, building construction or real estate. Together, the committee has been charged to analyze enrollment histories, projections, facility utilization and boundaries and make recommendations for potential future growth.

Over the past few months the committee has been meeting with the district's Executive Director of Construction Services, Doug Gallios, to thoroughly analyze how the district determines student enrollment and plans for the

future. Topics being discussed by the committee includes school additions, a district feeder system and the potential of constructing a third high school.

The committee's report will include proposed recommendations for the Board's consideration.

The October 6 Board of Education meeting is scheduled to begin at 7 p.m. in the Oswego East High School Community Room, 1525 Harvey Road in Oswego.

- Approved hiring a part-time kindergarten teacher at Boulder Hill and East View; a special education teacher and a science/language arts teacher at Traughber and a first-grade teacher's assistant at Grande Park in response to the district's first-day enrollment figures.
- Expanded policy 6:15-Instruction to include information regarding School Choice.
- Employed Prudential Doss Real Estate to sell the 2008 Building Trades House at 239 Liszka Lane in Oswego.
- Donated three 1998 school buses to the Oswego Fire Department for training purposes.
